Shoestring Budget

Do you want to make some extra money without getting a full time job? Do you want to create something that you can earn a little or a lot, to help you fund your vacation plans, become debt-free or buy a new wardrobe?

Take some time to flip through this "idea generator" and create a stream of income that will change your life!

9. Massage on the Go - If you have training in massage therapy, then you will love this one. Once a week book to go into a corporate or business setting. If you know companies that put on full-day conferences, ask if they will "employ" you to come in and use your massage chair for neck and back massages. 11. Got a Carpet Cleaner and Want to

Make Some Cash? - Ask your friends and family members or drop off a flyer in your neighborhood mailboxes. Charge \$25 per hour to clean carpets in your area. 1 hour a day can add up to \$125 per week. If you have to drive outside of your area, charge \$5.00 administration fee to

cover gas.

12. Be a "Book Seller" - Love personal development books? Go online and find a list of authors who would love you to promote their books. You take royalty or buy the books wholesale. Trust me, this could be more lucrative than you imagine. I happen to know of hundreds of authors who would love to have a book sale person. They may even tell you exactly HOW they want you to sell the books and pay you an hourly rate AND commissions.
